The (Ce)<sup>2</sup> Workshop is a joint initiative of the Centre for Economic Analysis (CenEA, Poland) and the Centre for Microdata Methods and Practice (CeMMAP, UK). The seventh edition of the Workshop will take place in Warsaw on 27-28 June 2022.

### Organization:

A Poster Session will be organised as an integral part of this year's Workshop in addition to the regular presentations. The programme for the latter has been finalised and is available on the Workshop's webpage. Topics listed above will be given priority and the total number of posters will not exceed 15. As the Workshop will take place in person, the authors of posters will have ample opportunity to discuss their research with other Workshop participants. They will be expected to be present during both days of the Workshop.

### Procedures:

There is no conference fee but participants are expected to cover their own travel and accommodation costs. Authors will also prepare and print their own posters, size A1 maximum.
